Let's Go Bowling!

It's a cold, rainy, winter day. You and your family are bored. You want to have some fun. You can't go outside. What <u>can</u> you do? Why not go bowling?

Drive to the bowling alley and park the car. Inside, put on bowling shoes. These shoes have special soles and are funny colors. Then choose a ball. Some balls are heavy. Others are light. The balls have three holes where you put your thumb and middle and ring fingers.

Next, find an empty lane. A lane looks like a long, wooden hallway. It has a ditch, called a gutter, along each side. At the far end are ten wooden pins. You must try to knock the pins down.

Pick up your ball and aim it at the pins. Roll the ball down the lane toward the pins. Hope it doesn't go in the gutter! Listen to the ball rumble as it rolls. *Crash!* It hits some of the pins. Down they fall. Hooray for you!
